- Married (1 Corinthians 9:5; Matthew 8:14; Luke 4:38)

AS A DISCIPLE

- · Didn't immediately follow Jesus full-time
- Miracle catch of fish led Peter to commit to being a "fisher of men" (Luke 5:1-11)

A DISCIPLE OF JESUS

- · Was one of Jesus' 12 disciples
- Was part of Jesus' inner circle, along with James and John (Matthew 17:1; Luke 8:51)
- Spent 3 1/2 years traveling with Jesus
- Walked on the water (Matthew 14:22-31)
- Confessed Jesus as the Son of God (Matthew 16:13-19)
- · Was rebuked by Jesus (Matthew 16:21-26)
- Witnessed the Transfiguration (Matthew 17:1-13)
- Witnessed Jesus' agony in the Garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26:36-46)
- Defended Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane (John 18:1-11)
- Denied Jesus 3 times (Luke 22:54-62)
- Forgiven by Jesus (John 21:1-19)

AS AN APOSTLE

- Present on the day of Pentecost, leading 3000 to give their lives to Christ (Acts 2)
- Healed a lame man and preached to a large crowd (Acts 3)
- · Preached boldly before the Sanhedrin, the highest Jewish court (Acts 4)
- Was arrested multiple times for preaching about Jesus (Acts 4; 5:17-42)
- Preached Jesus to the Samaritans, the enemies of the Jews (Acts 8:14-25)
